CHASKA WELCOMES NFSPS TO MINNESOTA!

Patricia Lieb and I climbed into our cars, then airplanes, then a shuttle bus to finally arrive at the Oak Ridge Hotel and Conference Center in beautiful Chaska, Minnesota for the 2016 National Federation of State Poetry Societies Annual Convention during June. While there, besides too much food, we were treated to four days of outstanding poetry and poetry education. Panel discussions included tips on better organizing for your organization, a particularly interesting and informative event for anyone who has ever been in charge of anything; a small press conversation by four local small press publishers regarding what, why and how they publish poetry and other books; and lastly, a few ideas and suggestions about how to go about writing.

Workshops dealt with presenting your poetry, making your own brand as a writer, using a word wheel for inspiration, kick starting your writing by free writing, and Walking with Words - an outdoor walk to learn what is around you everywhere followed by a short meditation and writing session. We also broke into groups of four and had a poem critiqued by the group. Very interesting to hear what other poets see in your work. Entertainment consisted of Poetry with music at the Thursday night Bar-B-Q, poetry read at certain spots along the Walking with Words event, morning and night open mics and, of course, the thrill of hearing the winning poems from the NFSPS poetry contests, and poetry read by several of the event presenters. Keynote Speaker Matt Rasmussen held us rapt with his, 'from the heart' poetry and Keynote speaker Natalie Goldberg regaled us with stories about how she came to poetry and writing while we watched a slide show of her paintings. Finally after absorbing so much of the beautiful countryside around the hotel and too much food we climbed back into the shuttle bus, airplanes, and cars to return home full of poetry, knowledge and inspiration.

Florida Poet Laureate presents in College Park by Teresa TL Bruce

If you overheard people speaking in verse—or the sound of bagpipes—in College Park during the weekend of April 15 & 16, chances are you encountered the Florida State Poets Association (FSPA) Spring Fling, which has been held annually since 1974.

Florida Poet Laureate Peter Meinke addressed this year's theme, "Found in Translation: An International Journey," urging participants to broaden their knowledge of other cultures. "Being writers, you need to have open windows, and travel is one of those windows."

Event chair Elaine Person, president of the Orlando Area Poets chapter, brought elements of intercontinental travel into the statewide gathering inside the Comfort Suite's Downtown Orlando.

—Reginald Lyle, pipe major with Rosie O'Grady's Highlanders, performed bagpipe tunes (while dressed in traditional regalia) and classic poems (with Scottish pronunciation and dialectical terms) by Robert "Robbie" Burns and Robert Service

—Paintings and photographs depicted scenes from one of Volusia County's sister cities, Bayonne, France.

—Workshops included the tricks (and trials) of translating poetry from one language to another.

—Open mic readings relayed poems inspired by subjects spanning Spain's Don Quixote to China's Miao people, and the themes ranged from somber to whimsical.

Observing participants after one workshop, Meinke said, "They're serious about poetry, but they like to have fun."

Approximately one-fourth of the FSPA's statewide 200-plus members attended. "The intimacy of having around 50 people increases the camaraderie," said Person, whose Orlando Area Poets comprise the largest FSPA chapter. "We look forward to seeing each other every year."

Person added, "I always learn something new."

According to Joe Cavanaugh, FSPA president, the non-profit is the fourth-largest organization within the National Federation of State Poetry Societies. He looks forward to increasing the ranking through the addition of youth memberships.
